Rotary Weekly Meeting

The 1478th Regular Meeting of the Rotary Club of Yala was held online via Google Meet on 12th September 2025. The meeting focused on the ongoing Global Grant Project – Teaching at the Right Level (TaRL) Phase 2.

This project is centered on an practical based teaching methodology aimed at improving the quality of fundamental education.

Rtn. Pramod Sagar Singh Pradhan gave a detailed presentation on the GG project phase 2.

Under Phase 2, 59 teachers from 17 public schools in Lalitpur and Kavre districts were trained in **TaRL** methodology for Math. English, and Nepali targeting Grades 3, 4, and 5. Teachers are now implementing the methodology in their respective schools. The first (Baseline) Evaluation has been completed, while the second (Midline) Evaluation) currently is ongoing. Results from the baseline evaluation have shown a positive trend in students' learning levels.





Rotary Club of Yala club convened its 1477th Regular Meeting online via google meet on 5th September 2025, with the main agenda focused on a business meeting.

President Rtn. Om S. Shrestha presented the club's financial report for the months of July and August, highlighting a net surplus of approximately Rs. 60,000.

Rtn. Pramod Sagar Singh Pradhan also briefed members on the service projects planned for Rotary Year 2025/26 and shared updates on the service activities already completed including the ongoing Global Grant Phase 2 project.



The 1479th Regular Meeting (12th of RY 2025/26) of the Rotary Club of Yala was convened on 19th September 2025 at Hotel Goodwill, Lalitpur.

The meeting focused on various aspects to be considered while conducting any service projects.

Rtn. Subhakar Baidya gave a presentation on "Some essentials of Service Projects" where he explained the Rotary value "Service above Self", Rotary/Rotarians as the change makers, project planning, need assessment, service project's goals, progression towards impact, securing funds, working with partners, beneficiaries'

participation, stakeholders' ownership for the sustainability of projects, club members' engagement, monitoring, evaluation and reporting, and public image enhancement through services.

Members appreciated his presentation about the essentials of service projects as very important for every Rotarian to know.


Kopila Nepa Receives Sewing Machines

RC Yala Installs Windows and Doors at Police Station

The installation of new aluminum doors and windows was successfully completed at Police Circle Satdobato, Lalitpur on 24th September, 2025, which was damaged during the Gen-Z movement. The restoration works comprising of 6 doors, 11 windows, and 3 ventilation windows at the entire building were carried out through Rotary Club of Yala, at a total cost of NPR 163,500.

With these improvements, the building of Police Circle Satdobato is ready to live and able to kick off its role in serving and protecting the community. Beyond structural repair, this project enhances safety, improves working conditions, and restores confidence in a key public service institution.

This initiative is more than a local improvement. It reflects Rotary's broader commitment to becoming a part of rebuilding the country. By restoring essential facilities in police stations, the efforts of RC Yala demonstrate how collaborative action can support not just reconstruction, but also the long-term development of the nation.











3rd Board Meeting

On 28th September 2025, the 3rd Board Meeting hosted by Vice President Rtn. Twinkle Nyanchhyon of the Rotary Club of Yala for the Rota Year 2025/26 was held.
