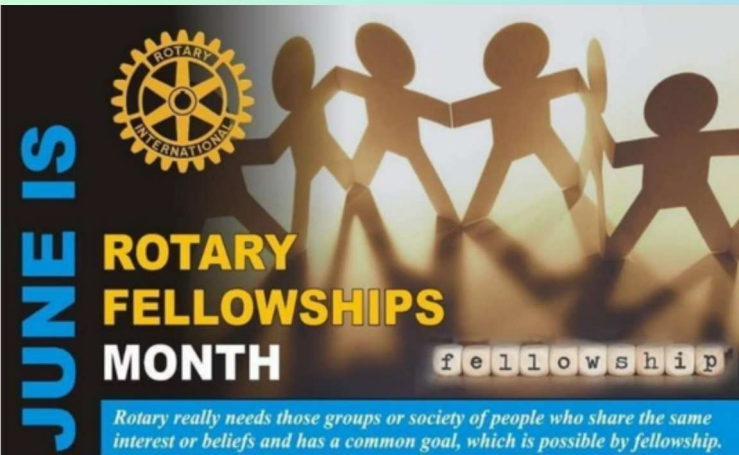




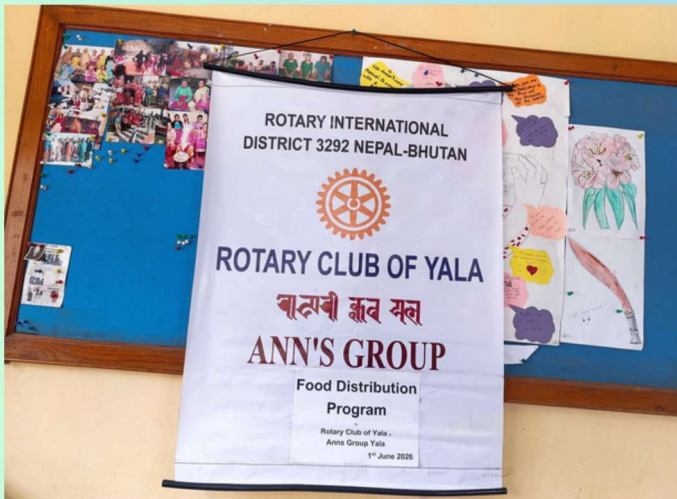

Fellowship for Sharing: Together of Parents

In response to the call of RI District 3292 to celebrate the District fellowship program themed "Fellowship for Sharing" as part of the observance of the UN Global Day of Parents (UN theme for 2026 : Together of Parents) on 1 June 2026, Rotary Club of Yala, in association with Anns Group, provided food supplies to Manjushree Elderly Home, Sampang Chowk, Lalitpur today. The program aimed to extend care and compassion to the residents of the Home.

The Home, established more than 25 years ago, is currently sheltering around 14 elderly women who have been left alone, abandoned, or neglected by their families and are living at the Home with full care, security, and companionship.

This meaningful initiative reflected the Club's commitment to fellowship through service and its continuing policy of supporting needy and destitute members of the community.

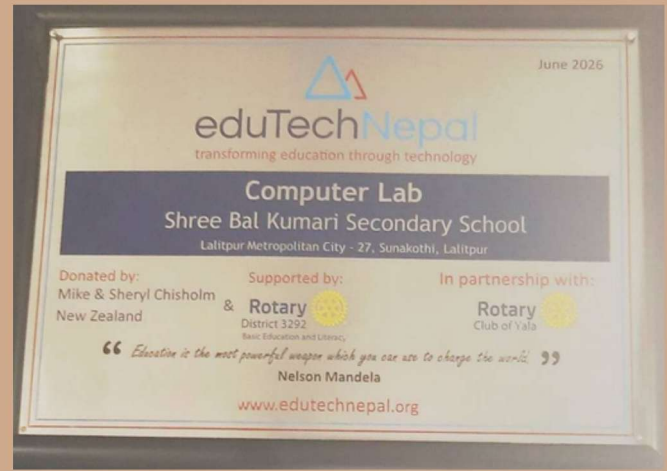
He also emphasized that the Club should give greater attention to membership growth, induction of younger-generation members and female members, and improved attendance in regular meetings as well as in service projects.

Rotary for Digital Educational - Support

On 5th June 2026, a Computer Lab equipped with 13 computer units, full power backup, internet facilities, and teaching and learning software was successfully installed at Shree Balkumari Secondary School, Sunakothi, Lalitpur. The project was jointly supported by RI District 3292, Edutech Nepal, and RC Yala at a total cost of Rs. 519,200, of which 50% was contributed by Edutech Nepal and 25% each by RC Yala and RI District 3292. The installation of the computer lab generated great excitement among both students and teachers, as it has opened up new opportunities for digital learning and teaching through educational software and AI-enabled learning tools. This has helped create a more technology-driven learning environment in the school.

Distribution of School Supplies



On the 5th June Rotary Club of Yala and Anns group jointly distributed copies, pens, and stationery items to 35 students of Shanti Basic School, Parche, Bandipur. In addition, various educational materials and sports equipment were also handed over to the school to aid in the students' educational and physical development.

AI and Cybersecurity Class at Kitini Secondary School

Successful Completion of One-Month AI and Cyber-security Training Program:

Kitini Secondary School successfully conducted a one-month AI and Cybersecurity Training Program under the Bagmati Pradesh Government, Ministry of Social Development (Samajik Bikas Mantralaya).

The training was concluded on 23 June 2026 with the objective of equipping students with essential knowledge and practical skills in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Cybersecurity to 35 students from Class 9 to 12 of Kitini School. The program focused on building digital literacy, promoting safe and responsible use of technology, and preparing students for the rapidly evolving digital world.

Throughout the training, students participated in interactive classroom sessions, hands-on practical exercises, and project-based learning activities. The training covered fundamental concepts of AI, prompt engineering, ethical use of AI, cyber security awareness, cyber threats, online safety, password security, digital privacy, and emerging technologies.

This program reflects the continued collaboration and commitment of the Rotary Club of Yala and Kitini Secondary School in empowering young learners with future-ready digital skills.

Ltd., volunteers, and all participating students for their dedication and enthusiastic participation, which made the program a resounding success.



Rotary WASH Program at Siraha Jail

On 15th June 2026, the installation of Bio-Sand Filtration Units at the Siraha Jail Office was successfully completed. Through this humanitarian project, a continuous water supply system was arranged by harvesting rainwater, enabling around 600 inmates, approximately 100 security personnel, staff members and visitors to gain access to safe and healthy drinking water. The project has also contributed to the control of water-borne diseases, ensured an adequate water supply for cleaning, washing clothes, and bathing, and promoted environmental protection and public health. The total project cost of Rs. 350,000 was generously contributed by Rtn. Surendra Govinda Joshi and Rtn. Pramod Sagar Pradhan.



This initiative reaffirms RC Yala's commitment to addressing basic human needs through sustainable and impactful service projects. By improving access to safe water and sanitation, the Club continues to uphold Rotary's mission of promoting health and the well-being of vulnerable communities.

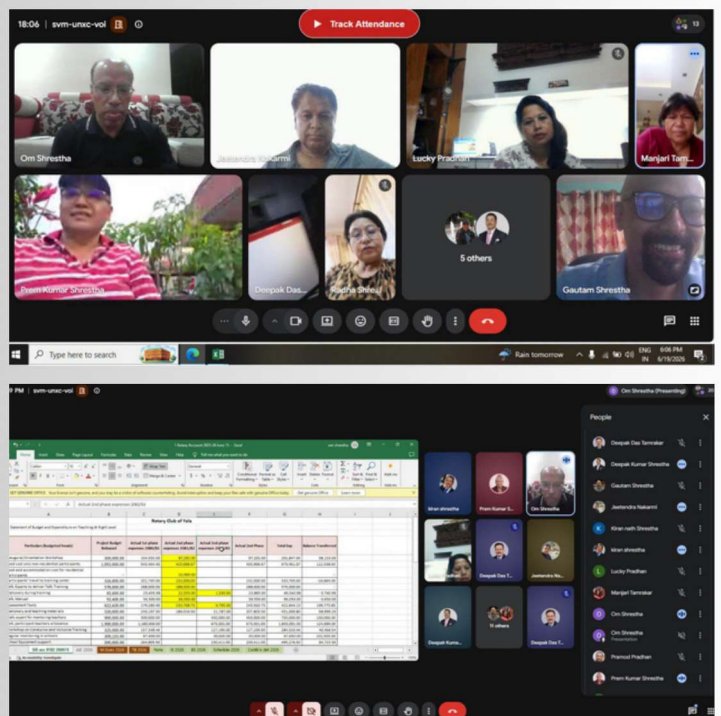
Regular Weekly Meeting -Online

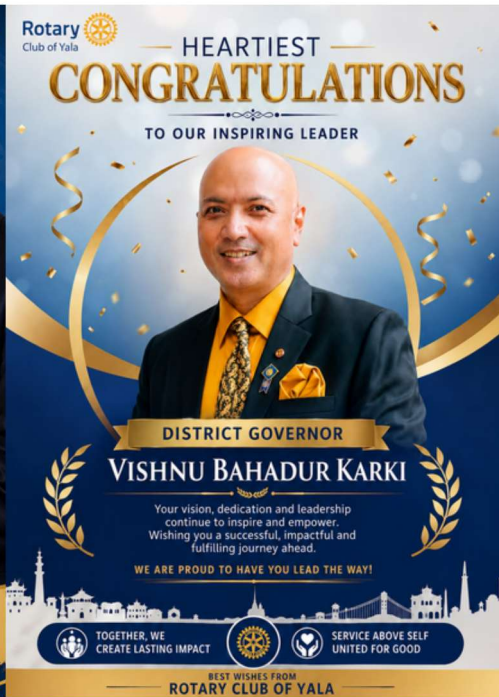
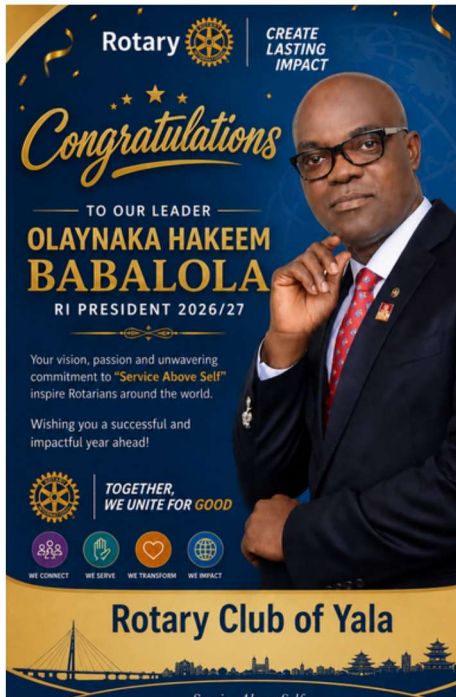
